Hospital files police report on twin abduction claim

KUANTAN: The management of Hospital Kuala Lipis has filed a police report on an allegation that a pair of twin babies who had been receiving treatment at the facility for nine months was taken by an impostor posing as a doctor.

In a statement made yesterday, the Pahang Health Department said it takes the matter seriously and has since carried out a pre-

liminary investigation.

"Investigations found that no twin babies, as alleged, had received treatment for nine months in the children's ward of the hospital.

"The last time the mother in question received treatment at Hospital Kuala Lipis was in July 2024.

"Regarding the claim of a fraudulent doctor identified as

Dr Amalina Husna who purportedly treated infants for a duration of nine months, the statement indicated that there is no record of such an individual having ever been employed at Hospital Kuala Lipis," the statement said in a Bernama report.

It said the hospital's top management lodged the report on Friday to prevent the spread

of baseless claims, which could damage the credibility and integrity of both the hospital's management and medical services, as well as the department in general.

On Friday, a Facebook post titled "Pair of Twin Babies Abducted by Fake Doctor at Hospital Kuala Lipis" went viral on social media, drawing various reactions from users.

Hospital lodges report over claim twin babies were abducted

KUANTAN: Kuala Lipis Hospital lodged a report over a claim that a pair of twin babies had been treated for nine months before being abducted by a fake doctor at the hospital.

The State Health Department yesterday said it took the matter seriously and had carried out a preliminary investigation.

“Based on the investigation, no twin babies, as alleged, had received treatment for nine months at the children’s ward of the hospital.

“The last time the mother in question received treatment at the hospital was in July 2024.

“As for the allegation involving a fake doctor named Dr Amalina Husna treating the ‘babies’ for nine months, there is no record of such a person ever having served at the hospital.”

It added that the hospital management lodged the report on Friday to prevent the spread of the claims, which could damage the credibility and integrity of the hospital’s management and medical services, as well as the department.

Malaysia lulus bina hospital medan

SEREMBAN - Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim meluluskan secara dasar menyediakan hospital medan di Myanmar.

Menteri Luar, Datuk Seri Mohamad Hasan berkata, perkara itu dipersetujui menerusi mesyuarat Kabinet yang dibentangkan beliau pada minggu lalu.

Menurutnya, Myanmar dalam proses pemulihan memerlukan pasukan perubatan merawat ramai rakyat tercedera.

"Sebanyak 84 hospital runtuh, jadi mereka memerlukan bilik pembedahan bergerak dan ini yang sedang diuruskan. Kerajaan akan meminta Angkatan Tentera Malaysia dan Kementerian Kesihatan Malaysia berbincang bagi tujuan itu.

"Secara dasar ia telah diluluskan, hospital medan ini boleh digerakkan pada bila-bila masa tapi perlu tengok jumlah doktor pakar yang akan dihantar dan per-

lu dibawa peralatan sendiri disebabkan masalah fasiliti di sana banyak terjejas," katanya pada Majlis Rumah Terbuka Aidilfitri Kementerian Luar 2025 di Kampung Tanjung Rantau di sini pada Sabtu.

Beliau berkata, pembangunan semula Myanmar bakal mengambil masa puluhan tahun untuk pulih dan berharap puak-puak bertentangan di sana mengambil peluang itu untuk bersama dalam mencari penyelesaian membangunkan semula negara mereka.

"Saya ingatkan kepada mereka, jika didapati pasukan keselamatan negara dan Asian terancam, kita tidak akan teragak-agak untuk menarik segala bantuan bantuan ke atas negara tersebut.

"Buat masa ini, tiada rakyat Malaysia yang tercedera namun ada antara mereka hilang tempat tinggal kesan gempa bumi tersebut," katanya.
